

Who operates and supports the Bellevue RotaCare Free Clinic?

The RotaCare Puget Sound Board oversees the RotaCare Free Clinics. An administrative Council directs the day-to-day clinic operations.

Approximately 75 volunteers rotate to staff the Bellevue RotaCare Free Clinic, including 25 physicians and nurse practitioners. Area medical sub-specialists and surgical specialists offer pro-bono consultations.

Overlake Hospital Medical Center provides both lab and x-ray support. Washington Imaging at Overlake Hospital and Bellevue Medical Imaging donate x-ray support.

Rotary Clubs, especially the Bellevue and Overlake Rotaries, provide financial support for the Bellevue RotaCare Free Clinic.

The healthcare volunteers of Bellevue RotaCare Free Clinic are dedicated to helping children and adults of all ages.

RotaCare Free Clinic - Bellevue

Free Urgent Care Medical Services for Washington residents who have no health insurance and limited ability to pay for medical services.

Who is RotaCare Bellevue?

RotaCare Free Clinic – Bellevue is a volunteer driven coalition of physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, pharmacists, interpreters, and administrative support, all dedicated to serving the uninsured in our community.

Free medical services include:

- Treatment of illness and minor injuries
- Screening for high blood pressure and diabetes
- Referrals for basic x-rays, bloodwork, and other tests
- Basic medications related to the patient's illness or minor injuries
- Referrals for special or ongoing care

Are there any fees to patients?

The mission of RotaCare is to provide free medical care to those with the greatest need, and the least access to health care resources. Visits to the Bellevue RotaCare Free Clinic are free for those who have no health insurance and limited ability to pay for medical services.

Patients may be seen one or two times for their medical care. Basic medications are provided free for the patient's illness or minor injury. Refills of these medications to treat a medical problem that continues will not be provided by RotaCare. Patients will be referred to another clinic which offers low cost or free care, or refills if there is a need to continue to see a doctor.

Basic x-rays, bloodwork, and tests that are donated to the Bellevue Clinic by other clinics are free. Tests that are not donated will not be ordered or paid for by RotaCare. Referrals will be provided to another clinic to get these tests, and patients can discuss the fees with them.

Patient referrals and appointments

Bellevue RotaCare Free Clinic welcomes referrals from social services and community organizations for adults and children who have a need for free basic medical care and medications.

To be eligible, patients must be Washington state residents, have no medical insurance, and cannot afford to pay for medical services. The Clinic offers urgent care, consultations, short term medications, pregnancy testing, health education, dental and eye doctor information, and referral for special medical care.

We accept patient walk-ins during the Clinic hours, no appointment needed.
